About Dr. Cheryl Finley (Creative Capital Board Member)

Dr. Cheryl Finley is the Inaugural Director of the Atlanta University Center Art History + Curatorial Studies Collective and Distinguished Visiting Professor in the Department of Art & Visual Culture at Spelman College. Dr. Finley is an Associate Professor of Art History at Cornell University, and also a Visiting Professor at the Visual Identities in Art and Design Research Centre at the University of Johannesburg.

A curator, contemporary art critic, and award-winning author, Finley is noted for *Committed to Memory: The Art of the Slave Ship Icon* (Princeton University Press, 2018), which won the Historians of British Art Book Prize, 1600-1800. Her co-authored publications and exhibitions of note include '*Free as they want to be:*' *Artists Committed to Memory* (Daminai, 2022), *My Soul Has Grown Deep: Black Art from the American South* (Yale University Press, 2018), *Teenie Harris, Photographer: An American Story* (Carnegie Museum of Art, 2011), and *Diaspora, Memory, Place: David Hammons, Maria Magdalena Campos-Pons, Pamela Z* (Prestel, 2008). Dr. Finley's current research includes *Black Art Futures*, a book on the history of Black artists, gallerists, and collectors in the art market, and *Pictures in My Mother's House*, a memoir. Dr. Finley received her Ph.D. in African American Studies and the History of Art at Yale University, and her B.A. in Spanish with honors from Wellesley College.

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Tamar Guttmann is an entrepreneur, producer, and advisor from Amsterdam, the Netherlands. In 2020, she founded the non-profit organization New Amsterdam Jazz, a festival bridging top talent of the Dutch and international jazz scenes. She is passionate about bridging the arts and impact and has co-produced a number of award-winning film productions and developed accompanying impact campaigns, including *Umama*, which won the Gold at the Student Academy Awards. Guttmann is the former head of the Coalition for Impact, a collaborative network that aims to mobilize trillions of USD toward impact among six of the leading social impact investing networks and foundations: BMW Foundation, NEXUS, Toniic, Center of Sustainable Finance and Private Wealth, Katapult, and The ImPact. Her other board affiliations include: The Netherlands Country Ambassador, NEXUS Global Summit; Advisory Board Member, Bergplass – HRH Princess Irene of the Netherlands' Foundation; Advisor Board Member, Business Plan for Peace. Guttmann holds a B.A. degree from Tisch School of the Arts and Stern School of Business (New York University).
