Creative Capital Celebrates Its 2023 Artist Benefit + Banquet

September 21, 2023 – <u>Creative Capital</u> and its community celebrated a night of creativity, friendship, and philanthropy for the nonprofit organization's second Artist Benefit + Banquet on September 20, 2023 at the Paradise Club, where Studio 54 meets Broadway meets creative energy.

Hosted by **Everette Taylor**, **Kimberly Drew**, and **Creative Capital Board Chair**, **Reginald M. Browne**, this year's Benefit honored visionary artists and their achievements in the field: Lynn Hershman Leeson (2008 Creative Capital Grantee), **Raven Chacon** (2012 Creative Capital Grantee) and **Ja'Tovia Gary** (2019 Creative Capital Grantee).

As attendees entered the Paradise Club, photographs of guests were taken in front of a pink "Creative Capital" neon with a silver lame backdrop. More than 75 percent of Creative Capital awardees in recent years identify as artists of color, LGBTQIA+, women, and artists with disabilities, and its education programs have served more than 80,000 artists globally.
